

Know all men by these presents, That we George S. Peagans and Shelton L. Morris³⁶ are held and firmly bound unto Commonwealth in the just and full sum of Fifty dollars of lawful money: to the payment whereof, well and truly to be made to the said Commonwealth, we bind ourselves, and each of us, our respective heirs, executors and administrators jointly and severally ^{buriedly} by these presents, and we hereby waive our homestead exemption in this obligation. Sealed with our seals, and dated this 17th day of April 1841

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas said George S. Peagans hath been appointed guardian of Isabella Mitchell the infant daughter of Penhagan Mitchell dec^d.

Now if the above bound George S. Peagans shall well and truly discharge the duties of his office as guardian of said Isabella Mitchell then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain, in full force and virtue
