It has been said that "death loves a shining mark," and seldom has this been more truly verified than when the death angel chose as its victim our esteemed countyman, Mr. Robert V. Suttle. After an illness of more than a month, he was called to his eternal reward in "That sweet and blessed Country, The Home of God's elect."

All that skill and human aid could do was done to prolong a life so valued, but human help was without avail. His funeral took place at his late home, "Ridgley," a short distance from Ninde's Store, Monday afternoon, and was largely attended by persons from all parts of this county and Westmoreland. Rev. J. H. Newbill, pastor of Round Hill Baptist church, conducted the services, and made an earnest and appropriate address. The pall-bearers were Messrs. T. L. White, John Olive, R. U. Owens, H. T. Garnett, J. C. Ninde and Dr. V. Q. Caruthers.

James W. Dishman died November 6th at his home, near Nindes Store, King George county, Va., in the sixtieth year of his age. Mr. Dishman was a member of the Junior Order, United American Mechanics, and a prominent member and deacon of Round Hill Baptist Church. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Anna E. Dishman, and six children—John A. Dishman, of Richmond; Mrs. Blanche Redmond, of King George county; Mrs. Nina Muse, of Westmoreland county; Misses Jessie and Alice Dishman and J. Samuel Dishman, of King George county. The funeral service was conducted by his pastor, the Rev. J. H. Newbill. The interment was at the family burying-ground.

Jas. W. Dishman Dead.

Mr. James W. Dishman, of Nindes Store, King George County, died at his late residence on Nov. 7th, after a long illness. Mr. Dishman was one of the best known and most highly respected citizens of King George. He has been a life long, consistent and active member of Round Hill Baptist Church, and has always taken the lead in works of charity among the poor people in his section. As a neighbor he was highly respected and greatly beloved. In his home life as husband and father, he was kind and faithful beyond expression and richly merited that warm affection which they all felt for him.
