## R. A. Peed Polls Largest No. Votes Cast In K. G. Tues.

R. A. Peed, seeking re-election to the office of the Commissioner of the Revenue for King George, polled the largest number of votes cast in the county's four precincts in the General election on November 8. Mr. Peed, having no opposition, received 975 votes, the largest number being cast at the Courthouse Precinct.

J. Cleveland Grigsby was re-elected treasurer with a vote of 970. He had no opposition.

Horace W. Morrison was re-elected, without opposition, to the office of Commonwealth's Attorney, by a vote of 813. Paul W. Manns, no opposition, polled 667 votes for Member of the House of Delegates.

Blake T. Newton was given 851 votes to assure him a seat in the State Senate.

In the contest for county offices which carried opposition in this election, Sheriff James Dishman won over his opponent, Warren Purks by a vote of 659 to 550. For the post of supervisor of Potomac District, Allen polled 164 votes; Butler, 234; and Darby, 127.

Mr. Garner was elected supervisor from Rappahannock District and received 270 votes. Mr. Howland, elected supervisor from Shiloh District, polled 229 votes.

Melvin Zepp won the office of justice of the peace from Rappahannock District with 240 votes, no opposition.

The three men elected justice of the peace in Potomac District were: Mr. Suttle, 374 votes; Mr. Gautier, 295 votes; and Mr. Shelton, 286 votes.
