Fredericksburg, Va., July 11.—News has just been received here of the death in Henderson, Ky., of Charles H. Dishman, Sr., the well-known railroad contractor, a native of King George County, who went from this section some years ago and had been remarkably successful. At the time of his death he was engaged in the construction of the big levee at Terre Haute, Ind. He built the Ohio Valley Railroad from Henderson to Princeton, and a number of other railroads. Mr. Dishman was fifty-four years of age, and died of heart trouble. He is survived by his wife, six children, three brothers and one sister.
